The public meeting to be held by the Downtown Development Authority of the Commercial Core Sub-District of the Lafayette Centre Development District acting as the governing authority of the Commercial Core Sub-District of the Lafayette Centre Development District (the “*District*”) will be held on **[July 14, 2022 at 7:30 a.m.]** at the regular meeting place of 735 Jefferson Street, Ground Floor Conference Room, Lafayette, Louisiana to consider the adoption of a resolution to continue the levy and to levy and collect within the District a 15 mill ad valorem tax upon expiration of said Tax on December 31, 2022 for a period of fifteen (15) years, with the proceeds of the Tax to be dedicated and used for the purposes contained in legislation creating the District, including, but not limited to: provision of enhanced services; constructing, acquiring, operating or maintaining public facilities contemplated by the redevelopment plan; and the operating expenses of the District, said expenditures to be made to implement the redevelopment plans and programs of the District, or any portion thereof, in such a manner as to aid and encourage private development, the continuation of which Tax was authorized by the electorate at a special election held in the District on April 30, 2022.
